1. The REP had a full discussion about the consultation- now concluded- about the final version of the Regional Economic Strategy (RES). The draft RES was positively received by the majority of those who engaged over the summer months.

## 2. Proposed refinements:

- a. Greater and upfront emphasis on the importance of the Just Transition to Net Zero and the significance of the economic opportunities it gives rise to;
- b. Acknowledgement of and explicit references included relating to nature loss and the need for nature restoration i.e. biodiversity as well as climate change emergency;
- c. A change in emphasis from 'conserving' and 'managing' Natural Capital to instead one of 'harnessing' and 'enhancing' it;
- d. Greater and upfront acknowledgement of the concept of Community Wealth Building;
- e. Inclusion of references to travel being 'sustainable' travel with explicit reference to 'active travel' too which is important for the region;
- f. Stronger and more consistent recognition that many elements of the RES apply equally to communities, organisations and the Third Sector beyond simply businesses;
- g. Stronger acknowledgement of deprivation, poverty and the importance of wellbeing, all of which the RES can help to positively address;
- h. More explicit acknowledgment of a number of opportunities particularly those for existing well-established key sectors within the region;
- i. Increased emphasis on being outward facing and working towards increasing the region's global reputation;
- The addition of a small number of challenges and clarification and simplification to existing ones;
- k. Slight rewording of a small number of priorities to better convey and sharpen up their focus.
- 3. The REP agreed to the recommendations in the report and to endorse the refinements to finalise the strategy and to endorse the final steps to launch the strategy
- 4. The REP was asked to agree the three year action plan and to ensure it captures the right actions at the right level.
- 5. Actions should add value and build on the themes and priorities in the RES.
- 6. People are eager to see the what and how so the action plan will be welcomed.
- 7. This is still a work in progress and it will take another month to finalise.

- 8. We are not starting with a blank sheet: Borderlands, SoSE are underway along with other good projects in partner organisations.
- 9. The discussion about the action plan covered the following:
  - a. Language of the action plan needs to have less jargon and fewer acronyms.
  - b. Action plan needs to make links with workforce issues in NHS and social care.
  - c. We need a digital strategy not just a digital skills strategy.
  - d. All reference to 'businesses' should be followed by 'and social enterprises'.
  - e. We need actions that help us understand and remove barriers to innovation.
  - f. There are some areas which are in recruitment crisis and some urgent actions are needed.
  - g. Reference should be made to the ambition for a consultation on a national park in the south of Scotland.
  - h. Wind farms should also be referenced in relation to their role in the local economy and opportunities for energy self-sufficiency in the area.
  - i. More prominence for home energy efficiency.
  - j. Clarity about what is meant by community empowerment; top down versus bottom up.
- 10. Next version of action plan will be based on this discussion as well as Borderlands delivery plan. Final version for the REP should be ready by 1 October.
- 11. The South of Scotland Convention on 4 October.
